<u>Undated but probably second half of 1941</u>. Red Cross Prisoners of War postcard from *Addis Ababa* to *Ferle*. British censorship stamp in English and Afrikaans, Geneva Red Cross and Italian censorship stamps. The text reports that the sender was taken prisoner at Gimma (Jimma), occupied on June 21st 1941. Since it seems to be the first communication to his family, the postcard can be dated in the second part of 1941. The sender was held at the concentration/transit camp called "Campo delle Corse (race)", one of the three reported camps of Addis Ababa. The Red Cross forwarded the postcard. A very scarce prisoner of war mail from Ethiopia.
