

## **EDITORIAL**

In this issue, Fabrizio Salami presents last part of his study on the forwarding of valuables through letter in the Duchy of Modena, of interest to many collectors. Again postal history, Angelo Teruzzi presents the postal agreement between the Kingdom of Sardinia and Lombardy Venetia Kingdom (1844-1853), subject on which there was not really much to read; the same on rates for mail between Italian States and Belgium and Holland (and vice versa), described here very well by Thomas Mathà and Mario Mentaschi. There are also short but very interesting articles such as those by Giuseppe Pallini, Paolo Fabrizio, Vito Mancini and Thomas Mathà, which document unpublished postal events or the use of cancellations on which quite nothing was known.

Still in the 1800's, I continue with the presentation of postal frauds, this time relevant to the postage stamps of the Bourbon Kingdom on the mainland, including the issues for Naples Provinces.

Going to the 1900's, Enrico Malatesta shows an exceptional finding referred to a rail disaster of 1921 and Emilio Simonazzi documents the extraordinary adventure of a coach which, in 1929, carried passengers and mail for 1500 kilometres in Somalian land!

Again about Italian territory, Luigi Sirotti presents the rates of regular Italian issues used from 1944 to 1946, some aspects of which were unknown, while Fabio Bonacina proposes an article with the title "Aiuto, arrivano le novità!" ("Help, novelties arrive!") which does not need any further explanation and which helps in understanding what the present situation of modern philately is: it introduces the topical subject, that is the postage stamps for eighteen-year-old boys and girls, accompanied by my opinion on the matter.

Giovanni Fulcheris documents, this is the tenth part, the rates of the Vatican City, subject which is particularly appreciated abroad.

As usual, there are the columns which have been published in this Magazine from the first issues.
