In the context of the awards ceremony for the "Bergamofil" event, the announcement by the president of the Federation of Italian philatelic societies, Bruno Crevato-Selvaggi: the name of Valeria Vaccari has been included in the Roll of Honour of Italian philately for the meritorious class.

"She has been active for 35 years in the marketing of philatelic books and in philatelic publishing - this is what we read in the motivation - she has contributed greatly to the diffusion and development of national philatelic literature and culture: she discovers and disseminates the works of others; she accepts publishing proposals; she encourages, promotes, researches, proposes and suggests authors and editions".

"Her work is therefore the continuous, passionate and convinced work of those who believe in diffusion, research and literature to increase philately. The recognition of her works as a global point of reference for philatelic publishing is an indispensable tool, hope and viaticum for the national and international philatelic world".

In March 2023, in addition to the recognition of the on-line daily newspaper "Vaccari news", on the occasion of 20 years of publication, the certificate of merit from the Federation of European philatelic associations, Valeria Vaccari was appointed honorary member of the Italian Postal History Association, as a sign of recognition of the "long and continuous activity of qualified and indispensable support for high-level philatelic and postal-historical publishing", and also as a continuation of the fifty-year partnership with Paolo Vaccari (who passed away in 2022).
