#### **LOT 1029**



Piece of paper with two postage stamps of Lombardy Venetia of 1864, one 5 soldi and one 3 soldi, which were stuck in order to form the Italian Tricolour. Someone, probably an Italian soldier, wrote that it was to remember the 1866 Campaign and that the stamps were Austrian examples bought in Padua on 18 July [1866]. (Padua was liberated on 12 July 1866.)
